During the event, she learned about a program called Building Better Moms. Upon her return to South Florida, she asked Monica Hart to help her bring the program to St. Peter's. Ten moms were recruited to work with Rachel and Monica in planning for the new group. In September 2012, BBM was launched. The first year was a huge success and evaluations indicated that the moms wanted the program to continue. BBM is currently in its second year, and the future looks bright for this program. Building Better Moms has three components: *Learning* (through speakers and DVDs), *growing* (through small group interaction), and *serving* (in the church and the community). Program fee: \$35.00 Childcare fee: \$20.00 per child Building Better Moms welcomes new members. Interested persons are invited to visit the group to learn more about it. Nursery We currently have 2 nurseries available: Infant Nursery (Birth to 2 years old) and the Toddler Nursery (2years – 3 years)

Club 54 (4th- 5th): All fourth and 5th graders are welcome to come play games, have fellowship and be a true follower of Christ by doing mission work.

SALTY SERVICE

1 STRATEGIC PLANNING INITIATIVE

(1) MISSION COMMITTEE

History/Description: The objective of the strategic plan is to establish ministry areas based on 4 elements of "salty service" under which all community service projects will fall: Hands on Mercy, Justice, Earth-Care, and Relationship Building Ministries. The **Mission Committee** will be comprised of leaders of the above ministry areas. This group will discuss all Salty Service ministries in the church. Each ministry area will have its own committee who will Ensure The Goals Of The Strategic Plan Are Being Met.

HANDS ON MINISTRY 2014 INITIATIVE

History/Description: Alleviates the suffering of others through Mission Projects like Great Day of Service, Done in a Day, serving with C.R.O.S. This group will plan and implement a signature project for the church in 2014.

PHASE 1: To lead members/non members to experience missional gestures and then to create true impact by:
Continuing to develop the Great Day of Service as a church wide annual one day outreach event that incorporates multiple community service projects, in partnership with other non profits; providing a variety of individual flexible and impactful service opportunities within the community that can be Done in one day; Offering youth and adult mission trip opportunities to serve outside of our community/culture allowing members to engage in service locally, domestically and internationally; Promoting and educating members about the Mission Outreach programs that we support as a church.

PHASE 2: To develop a new signature project which will impact our community and will be actively supported by the entire congregation such as *Weekly dinners for community in need* - provide weekly meals to homeless and low-income neighbors, *Family Promise* - providing housing, on our campus, 1 week at a time to families facing homelessness; mentoring for vulnerable families, and *Bicycle Ministry* - collect, repair and distribute bikes to needy.

JUSTICE MINISTRY

History/Description: Addressing systems that cause suffering through support of programs like Free the Girls, UMCOR Fair Trade Products, building awareness about human trafficking and worker pay, also sheltering the homeless.

PHASE 1: Utilize our facilities to hold educational forums on justice issues that impact the local and global community regarding social justice ministries such as peace efforts, human trafficking, food security, bullying, inequality, racial justice, worker's rights, etc.; Done in a Day off site projects: feeding, clothing, shelters.

PHASE 2 : To develop a new signature project which will significantly impact our community and will be actively supported by the entire congregation such as *Outreach Food Distribution Ministry in the Community* - reaching those in need in their neighborhoods, *Weekly dinners for community in need*, and *Establishing a shelter for homeless*

EARTH CARE MINISTRY

History/Description: As stewards of God's creation we care by beach clean ups, gleanng crops, gardening projects, tree planting, park clean ups.
PHASE 1: To educate members on how to actively care for creation. To provide Done in a Day service opportunities for children and adults that will engage them in and environmental stewardship. To be prepared to assist in disaster recovery for storms, tornadoes, and hurricanes

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Songs are on CDs, with puppets lip sync. Puppet message is read from a script using microphones in the sanctuary. **Future shows?** Monthly for Sunday school classes and outreach to special needs children if there is interest. Dates for Royal Manor are flexible on Wed. Next shows are Jan 22, Feb. 12, Mar 12, Apr 16 and May 14. Dates for CEC are Jan 13-14, Feb 3-4, Mar 3-4, Apr 7-8 and May 5-6.
